CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Dear Members,

A third successive preliminary final appearance in 2020 typified our Club's successes both on and off the field in what was otherwise a challenging year for our code and for our community generally.

As has been widely felt, 2020 was unprecedented in so many ways - a fractured season placed considerable strain on our football ranks, with coaches and playing staff making enormous sacrifices to keep the game alive and to provide much needed entertainment for our Members and fans. And within our office administration, our CEO Blake Solly and his team steered the ship through some treacherous waters to produce an excellent financial result, with our Club once again at the forefront of the NRL in terms of profitability.

Of course, much of this is attributable to you, our Members, who demonstrated unwavering commitment to our Club by not seeking refunds of your ticketed membership dues, thereby helping to maintain our revenues at the highest possible level in the circumstances. In doing so, you demonstrated that we are indeed a 'family' and, at times like these, we were reminded once again just how critical our 'family' of Members is.

All these factors contributed to an outstanding financial result, with a profit before tax of \$1.8m despite revenues falling by almost \$4m due to COVID-19 related impacts on ticketing, sponsorship, hospitality and merchandise.

As Members know, with our office tenure at Redfern coming to an end, the Club found a natural home at Souths Juniors where we have been welcomed with open arms by the Souths Juniors family. Our heartfelt thanks are again due to President Keith McCraw and his Board for the hospitality and warmth they have demonstrated towards our staff.

Like all Rabbitohs fans, I am sure you felt a sense of pride at seeing our District and Junior Clubs coming together during these transformative years. Of course, this will see our Club eventually find a permanent home at Heffron Park where we are shortly to commence construction of our new Community and High Performance Centre. In the meantime, there could be no better temporary accommodation for us.

From a community perspective, our charitable arm, Souths Cares, has continued to play an important role with its outreach programs. My congratulations go to Chair James Patterson, his Board, and General Manager Alisha Parker-Elzev for demonstrating the importance of charitable giving within a sporting context and the responsibility we all bear as citizens within our broader community.

As we enter a new season full of expectation for strong on-field performance and sustainable financial results, may I thank my fellow Board Members on both the Football Club and Member Co. Boards for their dedication to our great Club.

I close this report as I began by thanking all of you, our Loyal Members, for showing the characteristic tenacity and endurance that only Rabbitohs Members can muster.

Without you, our Members, we are indeed nothing.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. REPORTING ENTITY

The Company is incorporated and domiciled in Australia as a Company limited by guarantee. In accordance with the Constitution of the Company, every member of the Company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$4 per member in the event of the winding up of the Company during the time that he or she is a member or within one year thereafter.

The principal activities of the Company during the course of the financial year were the administration and management of members' interests in the South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited ("The Football Club").

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

(a) Statement of compliance
In the opinion of the directors, the Company is not publicly accountable. The financial statements are Tier 2 general purpose financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001. The financial report of the Company complies with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements framework.

They were authorised for issue by the Board of Directors on 15 December 2020. Details of the Company's accounting policies, including changes during the year, are included in Note 3.

(b) Basis of measurement
The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

The financial report is presented in Australian dollars, which is the Company's functional currency.

(d) Use of estimates and judgements
In preparing these financial statements in conformity with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively.

(e) New accounting policies adopted during the year

The Company has initially applied AASB 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers, AASB 1058 Income of Not-for-Profit Entities and AASB 16 Leases from 1 November 2019. This was the first financial year the company adopted these standards. Due to the transition methods chosen by the Company in applying these standards, comparative information throughout these financial statements have not been restated to reflect the requirements of the new standards.

(i) AASB 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers

AASB 15 establishes a comprehensive framework for determining whether, how much and when revenue is recognised. It replaces existing revenue recognition guidance, AASB 111 Construction Contracts, AASB 118 Revenue and AASB 1004 Contributions.

AASB 15 is effective from annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2019. The Company has adopted AASB 15 using the cumulative effect method (without practical expedients), with the effect of initially applying this standard recognised at the date of initial application. Accordingly, the information presented for 2019 has not been restated - i.e. it is presented, as previously reported, under AASB 118, AASB 111 and related interpretations. Additionally, the disclosure requirements in AASB 15 have not generally been applied to comparative information.

The adoption of AASB 15 did not have a significant impact on either the statement of financial position, statement of changes in equity or the statement of cash flows.

(ii) AASB 1058 Income of Not-for-Profit Entities

AASB 1058 replaces the income recognition requirements in AASB 1004 Contributions that had previously applied to the Company.

AASB 1058 provides a more comprehensive model for accounting for income of not-for-profit entities and specifies that:

- the timing of revenue or income recognition will depend on whether a performance obligation is identified or a liability is recognised;
- not-for-profit lessees can elect to recognise assets, including leases, provided that significantly less than fair value, at their fair value; and
- all not-for-profit entities can elect to recognise volunteer services at fair value if the fair value of those services can be reliably measured.

The adoption of AASB 1058 did not have a significant impact on either the statement of financial position, statement of changes in equity or the statement of cash flows.

(iii) AASB 16 Leases

On 1 November 2019 the Company adopted AASB 16 Leases. AASB 16 Leases establishes a single, on-balance sheet accounting model for lessees. A lessee recognises a right-of-use asset representing its right to use the underlying asset and a lease liability representing its obligation to make lease payments.

There are optional exemptions for short-term leases and leases of low value items. Lessor accounting remains similar to the previous lease accounting standard (AASB 117 Leases), i.e. lessors continue to classify leases as finance or operating leases. Accordingly, a lessor continues to classify its leases as operating leases or finance leases, and to account for those two types of leases differently.

The Company has no lease arrangements at present and as such there was no impact from the adoption of AASB 16 Leases.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Financial instruments**(i) Non-derivative financial instruments**

Non-derivative financial instruments comprise trade and other receivables and trade and other payables.

Non-derivative financial instruments are recognised initially at fair value plus, for instruments not at fair value through profit or loss, any directly attributable transaction costs, except as described below. Subsequent to initial recognition non-derivative financial instruments are measured as described below. Other non-derivative financial instruments are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses.

Trade and other payables are stated at amounts contracted with suppliers/other parties. Trade payables are non-interest bearing and are normally settled within 30 days.

Financial assets at amortised cost

The Company's investments in term deposits are classified as financial assets at amortised cost. The Company's business model is to hold the asset to collect contractual cash flows on specified dates representing payments of principal and interest only.

(b) Investments in associates

Associates are those entities in which the company has significant influence, but not control, over the financial and operating policies. The financial statements include the company's share of the total recognised gains and losses of associates on an equity accounted basis, from the date that significant influence commences until the date that significant influence ceases. When the company's share of losses exceeds its interest in an associate, the company's carrying amount is reduced to nil and recognition of further losses is discontinued except to the extent that the company has incurred legal or constructive obligations or made payments on behalf of an associate.

(c) Impairment**Financial assets**

A financial asset is assessed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any objective evidence that it is impaired, in addition an expected credit loss is carried for trade and other receivables where required. A financial asset is considered to be impaired if objective evidence indicates that one or more events have had a negative effect on the estimated future cash flows of that asset. An impairment loss in respect of a financial asset measured at amortised cost is calculated as the difference between its carrying amount, and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the original effective interest rate. An impairment loss in respect of an available-for-sale financial asset is calculated by reference to its fair value.

Individually significant financial assets are tested for impairment on an individual basis. The remaining financial assets are assessed collectively in company's that share similar credit risk characteristics.

All impairment losses are recognised through profit or loss. An impairment loss is reversed if the reversal can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised. For financial assets measured at amortised cost, the reversal is recognised in profit or loss.

Equity-accounted investees

An impairment loss in respect of an equity-accounted investee is measured by comparing the recoverable amount of the investment with its carrying amount. An impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss, and is reversed if there has been a favourable change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount.

(d) Revenue

The Company has initially applied AASB 15 and AASB 1058 from 1 November 2019. Revenue is measured based on the consideration specified in a contract with a customer and/or in line with the obligations set forth in funding agreements in place.

Revenue from services to members and other patrons of the Company is recognised through profit or loss when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due, the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably, there is a risk of return of goods or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

(e) Income tax

The Company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997).

(f) Goods and services tax

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

The Company holds an equity interest in SSDRFLFC comprising 1,000,000 ordinary shares (25% interest) and 1 A class Preference Share. The Preference Share has the following rights:

- (a) Other than in respect of any of the matters set out in (b) below, the holder of the Preference Share has no voting rights at any meeting of Members except in respect of any resolution proposing to amend or otherwise adversely affect the rights attaching to the Preference Share.
- (b) At all times while the Company remains a public company limited by guarantee and owns the legal and beneficial interest in the Preference Share, SSDRFLFC must not, without the consent of the Company as holder of the Preference Share:

- (i) enter into a merger, joint venture, amalgamation or any similar form of arrangement with any other rugby league club;

- (ii) make any decision to list the share capital of SSDRFLFC or a derivative business of SSDRFLFC on the official list of a stock exchange; or

- (iii) change the Football Team's:

- (A) team colours from Cardinal Red and Myrtle Green (other than where the design incorporates colours other than Cardinal Red and Myrtle Green due to maker's marks or any minor modifications which are in line with other teams and trends);
 (B) name from "South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club" or "Rabbitohs";
 (C) rabbit logos (other than any minor modifications which are in line with other teams and trends);
 (D) home ground to a venue outside the South Sydney District (excluding ANZ Stadium, formerly known as Telstra Stadium); or
 (E) team song ("Glory, Glory to South Sydney").

6. INVESTMENT ACCOUNTED FOR USING THE EQUITY METHOD (continued)

(g) The Preference Share entitles the holder to appoint two representatives to serve as Directors of the SSDRFLFC board.

(d) The Preference Share has no right to receive dividends.

(e) The Preference Share is not transferable.

(f) The Preference Share must not be purchased pursuant to a selective buy back without the written consent of the holder of the Preference Share.

(g) No more than one Preference Share may be issued.

(h) The Preference Share entitles the holder to priority in repayment of the amount of \$1.00 paid up on the Preference Share in priority to all other Shares in SSDRFLFC in the event of winding up of SSDRFLFC, and thereafter, has no further right to participate in any further assets of SSDRFLFC upon its winding up.

(i) Based on the above rights, the Company is deemed to have significant influence over SSDRFLFC.

Direct costs with respect to membership (e.g. postage etc) were charged at cost. No charge was levied with respect to the value of time incurred by employees of the Football Club in providing such support, nor was there a 5% uplift to costs incurred by the Football Club in providing the administrative support as permitted under the South Sydney Rabbitohs Co-Operation and Subscription Deed.

The excess derived for the year ended 31 October 2020 of \$346,921 (2019: \$346,576) was granted to the Football Club in accordance with the terms of the restructure contained in the South Sydney Rabbitohs Co-Operation and Subscription Deed.

The excess for the year excludes share of profit/(loss) of associate as the South Sydney Rabbitohs Co-Operation and Subscription Deed notes that the amounts to be granted to the Football Club exclude amounts attributable to dividends received from the Football Club. The share of profits of associate would be realised through the declaration of dividends from the Football Club and thus should be excluded to ensure any future dividends will be beneficially received by the Company.

At the reporting date, an amount of \$501,486 (2019: \$544,568) is receivable from the Football Club with respect to 2020 subscription monies received on the Company's behalf.

CLUB HISTORY

The Beginning...

South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club was formed at a public meeting held at Redfern Town Hall on 17 January 1908.

On March 5, 1908, the NSW Rugby League issued the Club its receipt No. 2 for their £ -1 - 1 - 0 affiliation fee.

The Club's first premiership match, also the first in the NSWRL competition, was played at Birchgrove Oval on Easter Monday, 20 April 1908. Souths defeated North Sydney 11-7. Winger Tommy Anderson scored Souths first try, with others added during the historic game by forwards Dick Green and Harold Butler, who also kicked a goal.

The Club was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee at a Special General Meeting on 13 June 1982.

The rebirth of the Rabbitohs began on 7 June, 2006 through a new partnership between Russell Crowe, Peter Holmes à Court and the 8000 Members of the Club. The voting Members of the Football Club voted by a 75.8% majority to convert the Club from a company limited by guarantee to a company limited by shares at an Extraordinary General Meeting held on 19 March 2006.
