Voting will conclude at 1 pm, or two (2) hours after commencement of voting, whichever is the later time.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

The Board of Directors of the Company propose the following Special Resolutions to amend the Constitution of the Company, and recommend the adoption thereof.

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following resolution as a special resolution:

That the amendments to the constitution tabled at the meeting, and for the purposes of identification signed by the Chairman of the meeting, be adopted and the current constitution of the Company be amended accordingly.

NOTES TO MEMBERS

- 1. The Directors have considered the current provisions of the Constitution relating to membership and believe that it is appropriate to change the membership which currently runs for 12 months from 1 November, to a 12 month period commencing on 1 January in each year. This change is being proposed to enable the Members to be provided with a further two (2) months to receive appropriate Membership collateral from the Football Club that will reflect the results of the season passed ,whilst aligning the membership year with that of the South Sydney Leagues Club. This is considered important under the 'one club membership philosophy' between the Football Club, the Leagues Club and Member Co. For the current membership year which runs from 1 November 2007, the change will mean that the membership year will be extended by 2 months and end on 31 December 2008. No extra membership fee will be sought from members in relation to this extension.
- 2. The Directors also believe that a minimum age of 18 should apply to membership, and the proposed amendments also effect this change, with the effective date being from the expiration of the 2008 membership year. A minimum age is considered desirable as this age is consistent with that of the South Sydney Leagues Club, and under the joint 'one club membership philosophy', creates consistency and efficiency for the administration of such memberships. It is noted that all memberships held by those members under the age of 18 years will be honoured for the 2008 year.

Subject to the above no other changes to the Constitution are proposed. A copy of the proposed amendments are available for review at the Club's offices, being 104 George Street Redfern, or by contacting Membership Services on (02) 8306 9953 or email on membership@souths.com.au.

NOTES FOR CANDIDATES FOR THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

As stated in the Notice, nominations for the Board of Directors must be received by the Secretary's representative no later than 5pm on Friday 29 February 2008.

The Club will immediately post a register of all nominees, and proposers, for the position of Director on the Club's notice board upon the collation of all nominations.

PROXY VOTING

The relevant laws governing Proxy Voting are contained within the Corporations Law. The provision of proxy voting is mandatory for public companies, unless the company is a registered (licensed) club.

The legislation provides that for a proxy's appointment to be valid, the Member must forward the proxy's appointment to the company at least 48 hours before the meeting. Accordingly, to ensure the validity of a proxy vote, the proxy must be delivered to the Returning Officer (care of the Club) by 9.30am on Friday 14 March 2008.

There are certain procedures for proxy voting that need to be adhered to strictly to ensure the validity of the proxy, including:

- The proxy form must be signed and dated by the member including name, address, and membership number;
- The proxy must be eligible to be a proxy:
- The member giving the proxy must be entitled to vote;
- Proof of identity of the proxy holder must be provided (a certified copy will suffice);
- Where the proxy has signed under a power of attorney, the power, or a certified copy thereof, must also be lodged;
- Proxy documentation may be received by post, hand, or facsimile at the company's registered office; and
- A separate voting paper will be issued and completed for each proxy received.



Chairman's Report

I concluded my last report to Members with the following words:-

2007 promises to be a year that we can look forward to with some optimism. It should hopefully be a time when we can all start to reap some of the rewards for many years of perseverance and even occasional pain.

Some twelve months later, even the most hardened cynic would have to agree that 2007 was a year of considerate achievement for our Club. Our first semi-final appearance since 1989 capped off a year in which many positive strides were taken, both on and off the field, to transform the Rabbitohs into a dynamic and leading force in the Australian sporting landscape.

As I write this report, the Club is set to announce a historic ten year deal with ANZ Stadium that will redefine the basis upon which sporting clubs negotiate the terms of their game day venue hire. With the Club now drawing upon committed support from across Sydney, from other states and territories and even from abroad, it deserves the best in terms of stadia and the best stadium in Australia is undoubtedly ANZ Stadium. And it is the best not only in terms of the facilities it offers, but also in terms of the commercial benefits that it returns to our Club.

In terms of our squad, we are confident of even greater on-field success this year and we are delighted that our Head Coach, Jason Taylor, has committed himself to the Club and the team he leads for another two years. With a highly skilled coaching team around him, Jason is well armed to build upon last year's success and make our Centenary Year something to look forward to.

So much has occurred in the last twelve months beyond the playing field that it is hard to summarise these achievements in one report. The Football Club's historic acquisition of the freehold of the Leagues Club site in partnership with the Trivest group was a deal that at last consolidated the assets of the Rabbitohs family under one roof and will enable the Football Club to derive significant benefits in the future. As we all know, the result will be an entirely remodelled

Leagues Club building that will provide a profitable return to the Football Club through the tenancies that are currently being negotiated. As part of this, our Leagues Club will see its own regeneration and will become an inspiring model for a new, poker-machine free, club environment that has already been so enthusiastically received by the public.

Hand in hand with these significant developments, is the work that is well underway to transform Redfern Oval into a state of the art training precinct that will serve our Club for decades to come and will ensure that our heartland forever remains in Redfern.

As if these initiatives were not enough, the establishment and growth of Souths Cares as a dynamic component of our business is, again, setting new benchmarks in sport. While sporting organizations have traditionally sought handouts to sustain their operations, here we have our very own charity assisting those in need, with a special emphasis on our indigenous communities to whom our Club owes such a debt of gratitude.

In listing these achievements, I cannot but reflect back to the difficult years we all experienced after our reinstatement in 2002 and the significant efforts made by many to see true change brought to our Club to ensure its long term prosperity. The partnership between our Members and Peter Holmes à Court and Russell Crowe has delivered outstanding results, both on and off the field, in a very short period of time. Within an eighteen month period, we have seen our Club propelled to the forefront of innovative thinking and dynamic leadership and for this we all owe a huge debt of gratitude to Peter and Russell, both of whom have demonstrated a commitment to the success of our Club that has exceeded everyone's expectations.

From the Member Co. perspective, the financial results enclosed with this report are encouraging. Importantly, the Football Club saw its revenues rise by over 37%. Not surprisingly, in a year when there was considerable one off expenditure, the Football Club's outflows exceeded its revenues by some \$2.7 million. This is, in fact, a better result than we expected,

and it is envisaged that 2008 will see a significant shift towards more of a break even position as the benefits of these one-off outflows are realised.

Of course, under the terms of our arrangement with the majority shareholders, Member Co, as the custodian of the core values of our Club, is only obliged to recognise losses of the Football Club to the extent of its net assets and nothing more. In other words, Member Co. can never have a deficiency in Members funds and this ensures that it endures so as to fulfil its charter of preserving those core values.

I know I speak on behalf of my fellow director Ray Martin when I say that it has been a pleasure and a privilege for the two of us to serve on the Football Club board as representatives of the Members. The sense of common purpose among the directors of the Football Club has been inspiring and our sessions have been both creative and productive. There is still a great deal to do, but the Football Club is now on a very solid footing in terms of its leadership and vision.

In closing, I thank my fellow Member Co. directors Jim Hatfield, Nick Hatzistergos, Ray Martin and Ken Stewart for the time they have given to Member Co. over the last twelve months. While the Member Co. board meets less frequently then the Football Club board, each one of my fellow Member Co. directors has demonstrated a commitment outside the boardroom to the new vision for our Club while at the same time remaining vigilant to ensure that it never departs from its traditional values.

As we enter our Centenary Year full of expectation and optimism, we should all be thankful that our hard work has at last started to deliver the results we have long hoped for. With everyone's support, I am confident that we are on the cusp of a new golden era for the Rabbitohs.

4. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the company during the course of the year were the administration and management of members' interests in the South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited ("the Football Club"), which it acquired following the restructure of the Football Club as detailed in the South Sydney Rabbitohs Co-Operation and Subscription Deed.

There were no other significant changes in the nature of the activities of the Company during the period.

OPERATING AND FINANCIAL REVIEW

The operating loss for the year was \$317,430 (2006 profit: \$317,430). This result was after deriving \$274,856 (2006: \$96,459) in membership subscription revenue, awarding grants to the South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited ("the Football Club") of \$111,010 (2006: \$83,577) and recognising a share of the trading losses of the Football Club of \$317,430 (2006: \$131,449).

6. MEMBERSHIP

The Company is a company limited by guarantee and without share capital. The number of members as at 31 October 2007 was 9,199 (2006: 6,862).

7. ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATION

The Company is subject to various environmental regulations under both Commonwealth and State Legislation.

The Board believes that the Company has adequate systems in place for the management of its environmental requirements and is not aware of any breach of those environmental requirements as they apply to the company.

8. DIVIDENDS

The Company is a company limited by guarantee and is prevented by its constitution from paying dividends.

EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO REPORTING DATE

There has not arisen in the interval between the end of the financial year and the date of this report any other item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature likely, in the opinion of the directors of the Company, to affect significantly the operations of the company, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the company, in future financial years.

10. LIKELY DEVELOPMENTS

The directors do not anticipate any particular change in the operations of the Company that will affect the results in subsequent years.

INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE OF OFFICERS

The Company has paid insurance premiums of \$6,511 (2006: \$6,811) in respect of directors' and officers' liability and legal expenses' insurance contracts, for current and former directors and officers, including senior executives of the Company and directors, senior executives and secretary of the company. The insurance premiums relate to:

- costs and expenses incurred by the relevant officers in defending proceedings, whether civil or criminal and whatever their outcome: and
- other liabilities that may arise from their position, with the exception of conduct involving a wilful breach of duty or improper use of information or position to gain a personal advantage.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE INCOME STATEMENT

The Company's total revenue for 2007 increased by \$178,397 to \$274,856. Total operating expenses have increased by \$150,964 with the Company also awarding grants of \$111,010 and recognising a share of the losses of the Football Club amounting to \$317,430.

Individual items that have significantly impacted the result include:

- Increase in the payment of a grant to the Football Club by \$27,433 (33%);
- Increase in membership revenue by \$178,397 (185%), reflecting the full year of operations of the Company;
- The recognition of a share of the loss of the Football Cub of \$317,430 compared with the recognition of a gain of \$317,430 in the prior year.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE STATEMENT OF RECOGNISED INCOME AND EXPENSES

Total retained earnings decreased by \$317,430 during the year ended 31 October 2007 to \$Nil (2006: \$317,430). This decrease solely represents the loss for the period as there was no income recognised directly in equity during 2007 (2006: \$Nil).

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE BALANCE SHEET

The Company's net assets have decreased by \$317,430 over the year. The Company's total assets have decreased by \$426,310 (75%) whilst total liabilities have decreased by \$108,880 (43%) compared to the prior period.

Major movements during the year were as follows:

- Decrease in trade and other receivables by \$108,880 (43%), representing amounts receivable from the Football Club;
- Decrease in the investment in associate by \$317,430 (100%);
- Decrease in trade and other payables by \$108,880 (43%), representing unearned membership income received.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS

There were no cash flows recognised in the statement for the year ended 31 October 2007, given the Football Club administers cash receipts and payments on behalf of the Company.

THE BEGINNING

South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club was formed at a public meeting held at Redfern Town Hall on 17 January 1908.

On March 5, 1908, the NSW Rugby League issued the Club its receipt No. 2 for their Σ -1 – 1 – 0 affiliation fee.

The Club's first premiership match, also the first in the NSWRL competition, was played at Birchgrove Oval on Easter Monday, 20 April 1908. Souths defeated North Sydney 11-7. Winger Tommy Anderson scored Souths first try, with others added during the historic game by forwards Dick Green and Harold Butler, who also kicked a goal.

The Club was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee at a Special General Meeting on 13 June 1982.

The rebirth of the Rabbitohs began on 7 June, 2006 through a new partnership between Russell Crowe, Peter Holmes à Court and the 8000 Members of the Club. The voting Members of the Football Club voted by a 75.8% majority to convert the Club from a company limited by guarantee to a company limited by shares at an Extraordinary General Meeting held on 19 March 2006.
