Despite a year of only modest success on the field, it is reassuring to note again at the commencement of this report that our membership numbers continue to swell. This is a tribute to the abiding dedication of Rabbitohs supporters across the country and abroad who continue to manifest their loyalty to our Club on an annual basis. The fact that membership numbers continue to grow without on-field success can only hint at what will occur when the Rabbitohs become regular semi-final contenders. We are confident that those days are now not far away.

At the end of the 2011 season we farewelled Head Coach John Lang who gave his all over two seasons and won the respect of many. As members know, John Lang is a man of great integrity and, while a combination of factors prevented him from bringing success to our Club, he nonetheless brought stability to our coaching ranks and for that the Board is deeply appreciative.

We were delighted during the course of the 2011 season to announce the appointment of Michael Maguire as the Club's new Head Coach for the next three seasons. Michael has been enormously successful in England in recent years, and this, combined with his prior experience in Australia, places him in good stead to become one of the NRL's leading coaches. At the time of writing, Michael is in the final stages

of preparing our squad for the trials and I can say that we have all been impressed with the vigour and intensity he has brought to our footballing ranks, both in terms of the training and fitness regimes he has implemented and the personnel he has recruited.

In terms of financial performance, the underlying results of the Football Club were no less impressive than in previous seasons. Revenues again rose, to almost \$15.5 million, a far cry from our corresponding revenues not that many years ago. However, on the expenditure side, one material difference in the year in question has been the additional liability the Football Club has now assumed for its occupancy of the entirety of Level 4 at 265 Chalmers Street. Gladly, this building is now complete and our Football Club administration now occupies magnificent new premises that incorporate a splendid new merchandise outlet.

The Board is confident that, as revenues continue to rise in coming years, this additional burden will be absorbed and that the Football Club will return to profitability. In saying this, we should be mindful of the enormous strides that have been taken in a challenging economic climate to renovate the Chalmers Street site, and indeed the entire Chalmers Street precinct, and to make our permanent home in Redfern a place that we can all be proud of again. With our Leagues Club to open its doors again in coming

weeks, I encourage all our members to frequent our special precinct in the heart of Sydney.

Once again, we were blessed with the support of a host of sponsors during the course of the 2011 season and were privileged to be part of the re-launch of The Star as Sydney's pre-eminent entertainment venue. In the forthcoming year, we are delighted to welcome a new major sponsor, Alcatel Onetouch, which will join DēLonghi, Kenwood and The Star as one of our four major sponsors. They are supported by a dedicated group of mid-tier sponsors and small business supporters all of whom continue to share their hard won business integrity with our Club.

As in prior years, the Board of Member Co. has worked diligently to ensure that member's interests are protected within our unique corporate structure. As I observed last year, and as member revenues continue to grow, Member Co. increases in its importance as the custodian of the Club's core values. Once again, this growing importance is reflective of the substantial commitment members make annually to our Club.

The directors present their report together with the financial report of South Sydney Members Rugby League Football Club Limited ('the Company') for the financial year ended 31 October 2011 and the auditor's report thereon.

4. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the Company during the course of the financial year were the administration and management of members' interests in the South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited ("the Football Club").

There were no significant changes in the nature of the activities of the Company during the year.

5. OPERATING AND FINANCIAL REVIEW

The operating result for the year was nil (2010: nil). This result was after deriving \$490,573 (2010: \$448,000) in membership subscription revenue, awarding grants to the Football Club of \$192,768 (2010: \$182,256) and recognising a share of the trading profits/(losses) of the Football Club of nil (2010: nil).

The operating profit/(loss) before financing costs of the Football Club for the year was a loss of \$419,146 (2010: profit of \$627,746) and the Football Club operating profit/(loss) after financing costs was a loss of \$864,226 (2010: profit of \$60,644), resulting in a negative movement of \$924,870 between financial years. The most significant reason for this is the increase in lease costs of \$737,678 for the Football Club's administration office located at Level 4, 265 Chalmers Street, Redfern.

6. SHORT AND LONG TERM OBJECTIVES AND CURRENT STRATEGY

The Company's objectives and strategies are consistent with, and aligned to, the Football Club's annual budget and two year business plan (2011-2013). The objectives, both short and long term, of this business plan, are to achieve sustained on-field success, ensure financial viability, and be good corporate citizens through the positive actions of the Football Club's related party, Souths Cares PBI Limited.

7. PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT

The Company's performance measurements are consistent with, and aligned to, the sensitivity analysis of key variables and targets established within the Football Club's annual budget and two year business plan. The actual performance of the Football Club's business will be measured monthly against these key indicators, and further, on an annual basis through a more rigorous review.

8. MEMBERSHIP

The Company is a company limited by guarantee and without share capital. The number of members as at 31 October 2011 was 15,418 (2010: 14,080).

9. LIABILITY OF MEMBERS ON WINDING-UP

Every Member of the Company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Company, in the event of the same being wound up while the Member is a member or within one year after the Member ceases to be a member of the Company, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Company contracted before the Member ceases to be a member of the Company and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up and for adjustment of rights of the contributors among themselves, such amount as may be required, not exceeding \$4.

10. DIVIDENDS

The Company is a company limited by guarantee and is prevented by its constitution from paying dividends.

11. EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO REPORTING DATE

There has not arisen in the interval between the end of the financial year and the date of this report any item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature likely, in the opinion of the directors of the Company to affect significantly the operations of the Company, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Company, in future financial years.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. REPORTING ENTITY

The Company is incorporated and domiciled in Australia as a Company limited by guarantee. In accordance with the Constitution of the Company, every member of the Company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$4 per member in the event of the winding up of the Company during the time that he or she is a member or within one year thereafter.

The principal activities of the Company during the course of the financial year were the administration and management of members' interests in the South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited ("The Football Club").

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

(a) Statement of compliance

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (AASBs) adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Corporations Act 2001. The financial report of the company does not comply with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS's) as the company has adopted the exemption allowed for not for profit organisations under AASB 101 "Presentation of Financial Statements".

The financial statements were approved by the Board of Directors on 17th January 2012.

(b) Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

The financial report is presented in Australian dollars, which is the Company's functional currency.

(d) Use of estimates and judgements
The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Financial instruments

(i) Non-derivative financial instruments
Non-derivative financial instruments comprise trade and other receivables and trade and other payables.

Non-derivative financial instruments are recognised initially at fair value plus, for instruments not at fair value through profit or loss, any directly attributable transaction costs, except as described below. Subsequent to initial recognition non-derivative financial instruments are measured as described below.

Other non-derivative financial instruments are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses.

Trade and other payables are stated at amounts contracted with suppliers/other parties. Trade payables are non-interest bearing and are normally settled within 30 days.

(b) Investments in associates

Associates are those entities in which the company has significant influence, but not control, over the financial and operating policies. The financial statements includes the company's share of the total recognised gains and losses of associates on an equity accounted basis, from the date that

significant influence commences until the date that significant influence ceases. When the company's share of losses exceeds its interest in an associate, the company's carrying amount is reduced to nil and recognition of further losses is discontinued except to the extent that the company has incurred legal or constructive obligations or made payments on behalf of an associate.

(c) Impairment

Financial assets

A financial asset is assessed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any objective evidence that it is impaired. A financial asset is considered to be impaired if objective evidence indicates that one or more events have had a negative effect on the estimated future cash flows of that asset. An impairment loss in respect of a financial asset measured at amortised cost is calculated as the difference between its carrying amount, and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the original effective interest rate. An impairment loss in respect of an available-for-sale financial asset is calculated by reference to its fair value.

Individually significant financial assets are tested for impairment on an individual basis. The remaining financial assets are assessed collectively in groups that share similar credit risk characteristics.

All impairment losses are recognised through profit or loss. Any cumulative loss in respect of an available-for-sale financial asset recognised previously in equity is transferred to profit or loss.

An impairment loss is reversed if the reversal can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised. For financial assets measured at amortised cost and available-for-sale financial assets that are debt securities, the reversal is recognised in profit or loss. For available-for-sale financial assets that are equity securities, the reversal is recognised directly in equity.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(d) Revenue

Revenue from services rendered comprises revenue from member subscriptions and is recognised through profit or loss when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due, the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably, there is a risk of cancellation of membership or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

(e) Income tax

The Company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997).

(f) Goods and services tax

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In these

circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

(g) New standards and interpretations not yet adopted

A number of new standards, amendments to standards and interpretations are effective for annual periods beginning after 1 November 2010, and have not been applied in preparing these consolidated financial statements. None of these is expected to have a significant effect on the financial statements of the Company, except for AASB 9 Financial Instruments, which becomes mandatory for the Company's 2014 consolidated financial statements and could change the classification and measurement of financial assets. The Company does not plan to adopt this

standard early and the extent of the impact has not been determined.

- AASB 9 Financial Instruments includes requirements for the classification and measurement of financial assets resulting from the first part of Phase 1 of the project to replace AASB 139 Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement. AASB 9 will become mandatory for the Company's 30 June 2014 financial statements. Retrospective application is generally required, although there are exceptions, particularly if the entity adopts the standard for the year ended 30 June 2012 or earlier. The Company has not yet determined the potential effect of the standard.

4. SEGMENT REPORTING

The Company predominately operates in one business segment being the administration and management of members' interests in the South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited in Australia.

The Earnings Before Interest, Tax, Depreciation and Amortisation of SSDRLFC for the year was \$21,992 (2010: \$890,425). The operating loss after financing costs was \$864,226 (2010: profit of \$60,644). The most significant reason for this negative movement of \$924,868 is due to the increase in lease costs of \$737,678 for the Football Club's administration office located at Level 4, 265 Chalmers Street, Redfern (previously 104 George Street).

The terms of the related party loan agreements have been varied subsequent to the reporting date. As a result of these variations, loan repayments now commence no earlier than 31 October 2015, and interest has been waived entirely from 1 July 2011 until 31 October 2013.

The budget for 2012 indicates an operating loss before financing costs of \$204,318. This represents an improvement at operating level before financing costs on 2011 of \$214,828.

The Company holds an equity interest in SSDRLFC comprising 1,000,000 ordinary shares (25% interest) and 1 A class Preference Share. The Preference Share has the following rights:

(A) Other than in respect of any of the matters set out in (b) below, the holder of the Preference Share has no voting rights at any meeting of Members except in respect of any resolution proposing to amend or otherwise adversely affect the rights attaching to the Preference Share.

(B) At all times while the Company remains a public company limited by guarantee and owns the legal and beneficial interest in the Preference Share, SSDRLFC must not, without the consent of the Company as holder of the Preference Share:

(i) enter into a merger, joint venture, amalgamation or any similar form of arrangement with any other rugby league club;

(ii) make any decision to list the share capital of SSDRLFC or a derivative business of SSDRLFC on the official list of a stock exchange; or

(iii) change the Football Team's:

(a) team colours from Cardinal Red and Myrtle Green (other than where the design incorporates colours other than Cardinal Red and Myrtle Green due to maker's marks or any minor modifications which are in line with other teams and trends);

(b) name from "South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club" or "Rabbitohs";

(c) rabbit logos (other than any minor modifications which are in line with other teams and trends);

(d) home ground to a venue outside the South Sydney District (excluding ANZ Stadium, formerly known as Telstra Stadium); or

(e) team song ("Glory, Glory to South Sydney").

(C) The Preference Share entitles the holder to appoint two representatives to serve as Directors of the SSDRLFC board.

(D) The Preference Share has no right to receive dividends.

(E) The Preference Share is not transferable.

(F) The Preference Share must not be purchased pursuant to a selective buy back without the written consent of the holder of the Preference Share.

(G) No more than one Preference Share may be issued.

(H) The Preference Share entitles the holder to priority in repayment of the amount of \$1.00 paid up on the Preference Share in priority to all other Shares in SSDRLFC in the event of winding up of SSDRLFC, and thereafter, has no further right to participate in any further assets of SSDRLFC upon its winding up.

During the year, South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited ("the Football Club") provided administrative and back office support to the Company. Direct costs with respect to membership (eg. postage etc) were charged at cost. No charge was levied with respect to the value of time incurred by employees of the Football Club in providing such support, nor was there a 5% uplift to costs incurred by the Football Club in providing the administrative support as permitted under the South Sydney Rabbitohs Co-Operation and Subscription Deed.

The Football Club administered all cash receipts and payments on behalf of the Company. Accordingly no independent cash flows have been recorded by the Company for the current period.

The excess derived for the year ended 31 October 2011 of \$192,768 (2010: \$182,256) was granted to the Football Club in accordance with the terms of the restructure contained in the South Sydney Rabbitohs Co-Operation and Subscription Deed.

At year end an amount of \$183,303 (2010: \$196,795) is receivable from the Football Club with respect to 2012 subscription monies received on the Company's behalf.

13. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Credit Risk

The carrying amount of trade receivables represents the maximum credit exposure. The maximum exposure to credit risk at reporting date for trade receivables was \$183,303 (2010: \$196,795).

The aging of the trade receivable due from the Football Club at the reporting date was all current. No impairment loss was incurred during the year and no impairment provision was necessary at the reporting date.

THE BEGINNING.....

South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club was formed at a public meeting held at Redfern Town Hall on 17 January 1908.

On March 5, 1908, the NSW Rugby League issued the Club its receipt No. 2 for their £ -1 – 1 – 0 affiliation fee.

The Club's first premiership match, also the first in the NSWRL competition, was played at Birchgrove Oval on Easter Monday, 20 April 1908. Souths defeated North Sydney 11-7. Winger Tommy Anderson scored Souths first try, with others added during the historic game by forwards Dick Green and

Harold Butler, who also kicked a goal.

The Club was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee at a Special General Meeting on 13 June 1982.

The rebirth of the Rabbitohs began on 7 June, 2006 through a new partnership between Russell Crowe, Peter Holmes à Court and the 8000 Members of the Club. The voting Members of the Football Club voted by a 75.8% majority to convert the Club from a company limited by guarantee to a company limited by shares at an Extraordinary General Meeting held on 19 March 2006.

still the only team to win every game in a season.


