Dear Members,

As you will see from the report of our Chief Financial Officer, the 2019 season was another successful one for our Club. A preliminary final appearance under new Head Coach, Wayne Bennett, and a very healthy financial result, are outcomes that should make Members very proud indeed.

In financial terms, a Football Club profit before tax and extraordinary items in excess of \$1.2m is a result looked upon with envy by many of our competitors, particularly given the underlying increase in revenues of \$1.5m over the 2018 year, with our cash reserves climbing to \$5.77m as at 31 October 2019.

These results are, in large part, due to the hard work of our CEO, Blake Solly, and his Executive team, all of whom have been enterprising and industrious in the administration of our Club. To achieve such results in a challenging sports environment speaks in volumes about their dedication and commitment to our Club.

Needless to say, Wayne Bennett has brought with him all the excellent qualities we expected, and it has taken him little time to instil in our squad the standards that he is known for and so many aspire to.

During the course of 2019, we bade farewell to three of our great contributors to our 2014 Premiership, each of them legends of our Club. Of course, I speak of Greg Inglis, John Sutton and Sam Burgess, each of whom has left an indelible mark in our Club's history. I know that Members were delighted to see that all three have accepted roles within our Football Department which will see them remain connected to our Club, as they impart their considerable knowledge to our younger players and upcoming stars.

Members will also have been pleased to see that our relationship with Souths Juniors is as close as it has ever been. This is reflected in the fact that we will soon be taking up

FINANCIAL REPORT

It is my pleasure to present to Members the 2019 Financial Report.

It was another successful year on and off the field for the Rabbitohs in 2019. On the field, we reached the preliminary final for the second consecutive year, while off field the Football Club made a profit before tax and extraordinary items of over \$1.2m after

sum of \$300,000.

The Club also received the first tranche of Government funding **Million** for our Community and High Performance Centre (CHPC) to be built at Heffron Park. These funds are being held in trust by Member Co and will be applied by it towards the construction of the CHPC.

Member Co

The Member Co. financial results are described in detail in the Financial Statements.

The Statement of Profit & Loss reports a break-even result

for the year, as expected. Under our charter, Member Co is entitled to recognise a share of the Football Club’s profit, while it is protected against any losses. Member Co. will therefore recognise a hare of accumulated profits once the Football Club is back to a position where profits have been accumulated. We expect this to occur in the short to medium term.

The grant back to the Football Club of \$0.347m (2018: \$0.347m) identical to last year, with Member Co membership rising

\$29.7 Million slightly to 21,076 (2018: 20,710), while costs were slightly higher, notably for insurance.

The Statement of Financial Position reports a neutral net asset position. Trade and other receivables and payables include 2020 subscriptions purchased in advance totalling \$0.545m (2018: \$0.549m), which is almost identical to last year. The assets also include the \$5.7m of Government funding (and accrued interest on those funds), which is offset by a liability in that sum representing the requirement to spend that amount on the CHPC.

Football Club

As is customary, I also take this opportunity to provide Members with an overview of the Football Club’s 2019 results.

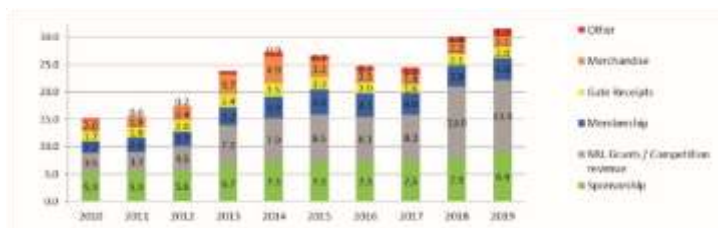
As already indicated, the Football Club was profitable in 2019, with a profit before tax and extraordinary items of over \$1.2m. The forecast for 2020 is a little more challenging financially, however the outlook for the following years is bright. **Net Profit before tax and extraordinary items**

allowing for a one-off contribution to Souths Juniors in the The Football Club’s revenues totalled \$31.6m in 2019, which was an increase of \$1.5m over 2018. Sponsorship rose by \$1m, which is an excellent result in a very competitive market. There was also an increase in other revenue from NSWRL Grants the Club earned by fielding its own teams in the NSW Cup and Jersey Flegg competitions. Naturally, these additional teams did have an effect on expenses, making up the majority of the \$1.1m increase in football costs.

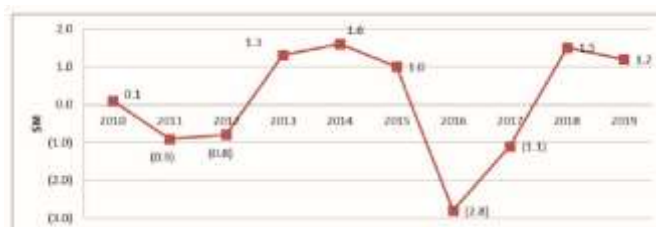

As noted above, the addition of teams in our pathway, as well as the increase in the salary cap, increased our costs in football by \$1.1m. Other direct costs increased in part in line with corresponding increases in revenues, as well as the \$300,000 contribution to Souths Juniors in this financial year.

The Club’s Statement of Financial Position reports a positive net asset position at year-end of \$4.643m (2018: \$3.797m) and a surplus in working capital of \$3.9m (2018: \$3.2m). Cash reserves at year end were reported at \$5.77m.

Conclusion

As will be evident, the Club has continued to perform well financially while increasing its investment in football. Our expansion into the NSW Cup and Jersey Flegg competitions and the fielding of very competitive football teams is what the Club is all about. Moving our offices to Souths Juniors is further evidence of the

underlying strength within our District, while the delivery of the long-awaited CHPC will further assist the Club in all its endeavours.

4. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the Company during the course of the financial year were the administration and management of members' interests in the South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited ("the Football Club").

There were no significant changes in the nature of the activities of the Company during the year.

5. OPERATING AND FINANCIAL REVIEW

The operating result of the Company for the year was a profit of \$nil (2018: \$nil). This result was after deriving \$670,600 (2018: \$658,955) in membership subscription revenue, awarding grants to the Football Club of \$346,576 (2018: \$347,278) and recognising a share of the trading profits of the Football Club of \$nil (2018: \$ nil).

6. SHORT AND LONG TERM OBJECTIVES AND CURRENT STRATEGY

The Company's objectives and strategies are consistent with, and aligned to, the Football Club's annual budget and its three year business plan (2020-2022). The objectives, both short and long term, of this business plan, are to achieve sustained on-field success, ensure financial viability, and be good corporate citizens through the positive actions of the Football Club's related party, Souths Cares PBI Limited.

7. PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT

The Company's performance measurements are consistent with, and aligned to, the sensitivity analysis of key variables and targets established within the Football Club's annual budget and its business plan. The actual performance of the Football Club's business are measured monthly against these key indicators, and further, on an annual basis through a more rigorous review.

8. MEMBERSHIP

The Company is a company limited by guarantee and without share capital. The number of members as at 31 October 2019 was 21,076 (2018: 20,710).

9. LIABILITY OF MEMBERS ON WINDING-UP

Every Member of the Company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Company, in the event of the same being wound up while the Member is a member or within one year after the Member ceases to be a member of the Company, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Company contracted before the Member ceases to be a member of the Company and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up and for adjustment of rights of the contributors among themselves, such amount as may be required, not exceeding \$4.

10. DIVIDENDS

The Company is a company limited by guarantee and is prevented by its constitution from paying dividends.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. REPORTING ENTITY The Company is incorporated and domiciled in Australia as a Company limited by guarantee. In accordance with the Constitution of the Company, every member of the Company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$4 per member in the event of the winding up of the Company during the time that he or she is a member or within one year thereafter.

The principal activities of the Company during the course of the financial year were the administration and management of members' interests in the South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club Limited ("The Football Club").

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

(a) Statement of compliance

In the opinion of the directors, the Company is not publicly accountable. The financial statements are Tier 2 general purpose financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001. The financial report of the Company complies with Australian Accounting Standard – Reduced Disclosure Requirements framework.

They were authorised for issue by the Board of Directors on 17 December 2019. Details of the Company's accounting policies, including changes during the year, are included in Note 3.

(b) Basis of measurement The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

The financial report is presented in Australian dollars, which is the Company's functional currency.

(d) Use of estimates and judgements In preparing these financial statements in conformity with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets,

liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Financial instruments

Non-derivative financial instruments Non-derivative financial instruments comprise trade and other receivables and trade and other payables. Non-derivative financial instruments are recognised initially at fair value plus, for instruments not at fair value through profit or loss, any directly attributable transaction costs, except as described below. Subsequent to initial recognition non-derivative financial instruments are measured as described below. Other non-derivative financial instruments are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses.

Trade and other payables are stated at amounts contracted with suppliers/other parties. Trade payables are non-interest bearing and are normally settled within 30 days.

Financial assets at amortised cost The Company's investments in term deposits are classified as financial assets at amortised cost. The Company's business model is to hold the asset to collect contractual cash flows on specified dates representing payments of principal and interest only.

(b) Investments in associates Associates are those entities in which the company has significant influence, but not control, over the financial and operating policies. The financial statements includes the company's share of the total recognised gains and losses of associates on an equity accounted basis, from the date that significant influence commences until the date that significant influence ceases. When the company's share of losses exceeds its interest in an associate, the company's carrying amount is reduced to nil and recognition of further losses is discontinued except to the extent that the company has incurred legal or constructive obligations or made payments on behalf of an associate.

(c) Impairment

Financial assets A financial asset is assessed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any objective

evidence that it is impaired, in addition an expected credit loss is carried for trade and other receivables where required. A financial asset is considered to be impaired if objective evidence indicates that one or more events have had a negative effect on the estimated future cash flows of that asset. An impairment loss in respect of a financial asset measured at amortised cost is calculated as the difference between its carrying amount, and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the original effective interest rate. An impairment loss in respect of an available-for-sale financial asset is calculated by reference to its fair value.

Individually significant financial assets are tested for impairment on an individual basis. The remaining financial assets are assessed collectively in companies that share similar credit risk characteristics. All impairment losses are recognised through profit or loss. Any cumulative loss in respect of an available for-sale financial asset recognised previously in equity is transferred to profit or loss.

An impairment loss is reversed if the reversal can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised. For financial assets measured at amortised cost, the reversal is recognised in profit or loss.

Equity-accounted investees An impairment loss in respect of an equity-accounted investee is measured by comparing the recoverable amount of the investment with its carrying amount. An impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss, and is reversed if there has been a favourable change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount.

(d) Revenue Revenue from services rendered comprises revenue from member subscriptions and is recognised through profit or loss when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due, the costs incurred or to be incurred cannot be measured reliably, there is a risk of cancellation of membership or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

(e) Income tax The Company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997).

(f) Goods and services tax

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

(g) New standards and interpretations not yet adopted

A number of new standards, amendments to standards and interpretations are effective for annual periods beginning after 1 January 2018, and have not been applied in preparing these financial statements. Those which may be relevant to the Company are set out below. The Company does not plan to adopt these standards early.

AASB 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers AASB 15 establishes a comprehensive framework for determining whether, how much and when revenue is recognised. It replaces existing revenue recognition guidance, AASB 111 *Construction Contracts*, AASB 118 *Revenue* and AASB 1004 *Contributions*. AASB 15 is effective from annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2018, with early adoption permitted.

The Company is assessing the potential impact on its financial statements resulting from the application of AASB 15.

AASB 16 Leases

AASB 16 removes the classification of leases as either operating leases or finance leases – for the lessee - effectively treating all leases as finance leases. Short-term leases (less than 12 months) and leases of low-value assets (such as personal computers) are exempt from the lease accounting requirements. There are also changes in accounting over the life of the lease. In particular, companies will not recognise a front-loaded pattern of expenses for most leases, even when they pay constant rentals.

Lessor accounting remains similar to current practice i.e. lessors continue to classify leases as finance and operating leases. AASB 16 is effective from annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2019, with early adoption permitted for entities that also adopt AASB 15. The Company is assessing the potential impact on its financial statements resulting from the application of AASB 16.

AASB 9 Financial Instruments

On 1 November 2018 the Company adopted *AASB 9 Financial Instruments*.

AASB 9 sets out requirements for recognising and measuring financial assets, financial liabilities and some contracts to buy or sell non-financial items. This standard replaces *AASB 139 Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement*.

No impact was noted on the classification and measurement of the Company's financial assets and liabilities, accordingly, the comparative information presented for 2018 has not been restated.

SOUTH SYDNEY DISTRICT RUGBY LEAGUE FOOTBALL CLUB LIMITED**The Beginning...**

South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club was formed at a public meeting held at Redfern Town Hall on 17 January 1908.

On March 5, 1908, the NSW Rugby League issued the Club its receipt No. 2 for their £ -1 – 1 – 0 affiliation fee.

The Club's first premiership match, also the first in the NSWRL competition, was played at Birchgrove Oval on Easter Monday, 20 April 1908. Souths defeated North Sydney 11-7. Winger Tommy Anderson scored Souths first try, with others added during the historic game by forwards Dick Green and Harold Butler, who also kicked a goal.

The Club was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee at a Special General Meeting on 13 June 1982.

The rebirth of the Rabbitohs began on 7 June, 2006 through a new partnership between Russell Crowe, Peter Holmes à Court and the 8000 Members of the Club. The voting Members of the Football Club voted by a 75.8% majority to convert the Club from a company limited by guarantee to a company limited by shares at an Extraordinary General Meeting held on 19 March 2006.
