CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Dear Members,

A third successive preliminary final appearance in 2020 typified our Club's successes both on and off the field in what was otherwise a challenging year for our code and for our community generally.

As has been widely felt, 2020 was unprecedented in so many ways - a fractured season placed considerable strain on our football ranks, with coaches and playing staff making enormous sacrifices to keep the game alive and to provide much needed entertainment for our Members and fans. And within our office administration, our CEO Blake Solly and his team steered the ship through some treacherous waters to produce an excellent financial result, with our Club once again at the forefront of the NRL in terms of profitability.

Of course, much of this is attributable to you, our Members, who demonstrated unwavering commitment to our Club by not seeking refunds of your ticketed membership dues, thereby helping to maintain our revenues at the highest possible level in the circumstances. In doing so, you demonstrated that we are indeed a 'family' and, at times like these, we were reminded once again just how critical our 'family' of Members is.

All these factors contributed to an outstanding financial result, with a profit before tax of \$1.8m despite revenues falling by almost \$4m due to COVID-19 related impacts on ticketing, sponsorship, hospitality and merchandise.

As Members know, with our office tenure at Redfern coming to an end, the Club found a natural home at Souths Juniors where we have been welcomed with open arms by the Souths Juniors family. Our heartfelt thanks are again due to President Keith McCraw and his Board for the hospitality and warmth they have demonstrated towards our staff.

Like all Rabbitohs fans, I am sure you felt a sense of pride at seeing our District and Junior Clubs coming together during these transformative years. Of course, this will see our Club eventually find a permanent home at Heffron Park where we are shortly to commence construction of our new Community and High Performance Centre. In the meantime, there could be no better temporary accommodation for us.

From a community perspective, our charitable arm, Souths Cares, has continued to play an important role with its outreach programs. My congratulations go to Chair James Patterson, his Board, and General Manager Alisha Parker- ${\sf Elrez} \ {\sf for} \ {\sf demonstrating} \ {\sf the} \ {\sf importance} \ {\sf of} \ {\sf charitable}$ giving within a sporting context and the responsibility we all bear as citizens within our broader community.

As we enter a new season full of expectation for strong onfield performance and sustainable financial results, may I thank my fellow Board Members on both the Football Club and Member Co. Boards for their dedication to our great

Without you, our Members, we are indeed nothing.



FINANCIAL REPORT

It is my pleasure to present to Members the 2020 Financial Report.

Despite the unprecedented challenges of the year, 2020 was a successful season on and off the field for the Rabbitohs. When the NRL season was postponed and under threat, the support of our loyal Members and sponsors was essential. That support, along with that of the NRL and Government programs, allowed us to make the adjustments needed to our business model for the 2020 season. On the field, we reached the preliminary final none again despite some very high profile players suffering season ending injuries in earlier orunds. Off the field the Football Club made a profit before tax of over \$1.8m despite revenues falling by almost \$4 million. Significant cost savings were achieved through difficult decisions being made and executed.

The Club also received further instalments of the Government finding for our Community and High Performance Centre (CHPC) to be built at Heffron Park. These funds are being held in trust by Member Co and will be applied by it towards the construction of the CHPC.

Member Co

The Member Co. financial results are described in detail in the Financial Statements

The Statement of Profit & Loss reports a break-even result for the year, as expected. Under our charter, Member Co is entitled to recognise a share of the Football Clubs retained profits, while it is protected against any losses. Member Co. will therefore recognise a share of accumulated profits once the Football Club is back to a position where profits have been accumulated.

The grant back to the Football Club of \$0.347m (2019: \$0.347m) was identical to last year, with Member Comembership rising slightly to 21,128 (2018: 21,076), while costs were slightly higher, notably for insurance.

The Statement of Financial Position reports a neutral net asset The Statement of Financial Position reports a neutral net as position. Trade and other receivables and payables include 2020 subscriptions purchased in advance totalling \$0.501m (2018: \$0.554m), which is down slightly on last year as membership renewals were one month later given the extended 2020 season. The assest asia oinclude \$10.587m of Government funding (and accrued interest on those funds), which is offset by a liability in that sum representing the requirement to spend that amount on the CHPC.


Football Club

As is customary, I also take this opportunity to provide Members with an overview of the Football Club's 2020 results.

As already indicated, the Football Club was profitable in 2020, with a profit before tax of over \$1.8m. The forecast for 2021 is again to be profitable, assuming the season proceeds in a normal fashion without material adverse COVID issues.

The Football Club's revenues totalled \$27.9m in 2020, a decrease of \$3.7m on 2019. All commercial areas felt the COVID impact and fell from the previous year. The reduced season length, with less total games and restrictions on crowds, including some games with no crowds, had dramatic effects on gate receipts and sponsorship in particular. Membership and merchandise held up well in the circumstances, but were still lower than 2019. Funding from NRL and other income (including Government assistance) increased over the previous year.





A Reduction in expenses was essential given the decrease in revenues. Football costs fell by virtue of a combination of player payment decreases, football staff reductions and the cancellation of the lower tier competitions. Other direct costs decreased in part in line with corresponding decreases in revenues and other reductions, while other operating costs reduced primarily from reduced staff rosts. reductions, while o reduced staff costs

The Club's Statement of Financial Position reports a positive net asset position at year-end of \$3.964m (2019: \$1.643m) and cash reserves were reported at \$8.479m.

Conclusion

The Club has performed well financially in an extremely turbulent period. The loyalty of our Members and Corporate supporters has been of the utmost importance. Continued profitability allows us to have the resources to field competitive football teams, which is what the Club is all about. We have now moved our offices to Souths Juniors and increased our role in assisting the Juniors with Junior Representative teams, furthering our commitment to Rugby League within our District, while the delivery of the long-awaited CHPC will further assist the Club in all its endeavours.

The future for our Club is cause for optimism.

1. REPORTING ENTITY

The Company is incorporated and domiciled in Australia as a Company limited by guarantee. In accordance with the Constitution of the Company, with the Constitution of the Company, every member of the Company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$4 per member in the event of the winding up of the Company during the time that he or she is a member or within one year thereafter.

The principal activities of the Company during the course of the financial year were the administration and management of members' interests in the South Sydney District Rugby League Football (Lub Limited ("The Football Club").

BASIS OF PREPARATION Statement of compliance

The financial statements are Tier 2 general purpose financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Permirements adopted by the Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001. The financial report of the Company complies with Australian Accounting Standard – Reduced Disclosure Requirements framework

They were authorised for issue by the Board of Directors on 15 December 2020. Details of the Company's accounting policies, including changes during the year, are included in Note 3.

(b) Basis of measurement The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

The Beginning..

South Sydney District Rugby League Football Club was formed at a public meeting held at Redfern Town Hall on 17 January 1908.

On March 5, 1908, the NSW Rugby League issued the Club its receipt No. 2 for their £ -1 - 1 - 0 affiliation fee.

The Club's first premiership match, also the first in the NSWRL competition, was played at Birchgrove Oval on Easter Monday, 20 April 1908. Souths defeated North Sydney 11-7. Winger Tommy Anderson scored Souths first try, with others added during the historic game by forwards Dick Green and Harold Butler, who also kicked a goal.

The Club was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee at a Special General Meeting on 13 June 1982.

The rebirth of the Rabbitohs began on 7 June, 2006 through a new partnership between Russell Crowe, Peter Holmes à Court and the 8000 Members of the Club. The voting Members of the Football Club voted by a 75.8% majority to convert the Club from a company limited by guarantee to a company limited by shares at an Extraordinary General Meeting held on 19 March 2006.






